



Student Assessment Result Comparisons


3RD GRADE STATE ASSESSMENTS

Facility Use

Pioneer Elementary opened for the 2002-03 school year. This two-story elementary school houses 31 classrooms for use as kindergarten through fifth-grade classes, music, art, technology, special education and remedial programs for both math and reading. The facility also includes a multi-purpose room with a stage for use as a gymnasium, lunchroom and for assemblies and events. School Improvement Plan

The staff at Pioneer Elementary are dedicated to improving learning for students.

Our School Improvement Team supported our Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) as we implemented a new data protocol to collect and analyze our trimester reading data. We engaged in productive dialogue on what the data is telling us and how to respond to the data to improve learning for each student.

For the 2017-18 school year, grade level PLCs will be unpacking the common core standards in the area of math while aligning our district adopted math curriculum to the standards. PLC teams will create common formative assessments to monitor mastery of standards and will analyze the results of the assessments based on a data protocol and student's scores to determine appropriate interventions and extensions.
